<p>Class Description: Basic Land Navigation class broken into 1-hour blocks, 4 hours total.</p> <p>Basic Map and Compass - Class will cover reading a map, types of maps, effectively using maps, triangulation, re-sectioning, and how to properly use a compass.</p> <p>Basic GPS - What is a GPS? What can it do for me? How does it work? Why I need one? What to look for when purchasing a GPS. We will also cover some basic GPS strategies and how to effectively use one in the field.</p> <p>Basic UTM - Class will cover what UTM is and how to use it. There will be several exercises in the classroom to help students grasp and become proficient in using UTM.</p> <p>Land Navigation (putting it all together) - We will cover everything we've been working on and put it all together.
